Castle Rock Woman Found Guilty of Voter Fraud

Castle Rock, CO – October 22, 2025. A Douglas County jury has found 61-year-old Elizabeth Ann Davis of Castle Rock guilty of voter fraud stemming from the 2022 General Election.

Prosecutors presented evidence showing that Davis submitted a ballot under the name of her deceased ex-husband while also casting her own legitimate vote in the same election. The jury also convicted her for casting a ballot for her son.

Davis was convicted on two counts of forgery and one count of "personating an elector." She has an extensive criminal record, including prior convictions for forgery, theft, drug offenses, and prostitution in both Florida and/or Colorado.

Douglas County Clerk and Recorder Sheri Davis praised the outcome. "There are layers of security built into the election process here in Colorado, and this case shows they are working," she said. "We appreciate having a District Attorney's office that takes attempted voter fraud seriously to ensure the integrity of elections."

Deputy DA Chase Helseth emphasized the broader implications, "Voter fraud threatens the core of our democracy. There must be consequences for those who break that trust."

Deputy DA David Bosner added. "Safeguarding our elections is essential. The verdict shows that the community will hold someone accountable if he or she compromises the integrity of that process."

District Attorney George Brauchler emphasized the seriousness of the case, stating, "Those who seek to corrupt our elections or dilute our votes- by even a single ballot- will find a DA's office intent on their incarceration. Here, a career forger learned nothing from her earlier convictions and soft treatment by our justice system. In an election between following the law and wanton lawlessness, Elizabeth Davis voted for prison....and we're working to honor that election."

Elizabeth Ann Davis will be sentenced January 9, 2026. She faces penalties ranging from probation to three years in prison.
