Highlands Ranch Man Found Guilty After Violent Assault on Mother of his Child

Castle Rock, CO –A Douglas County jury has found 24-year-old Keyahn Golgoon of Highlands Ranch guilty of multiple charges, after a violent assault on the mother of his child while she was holding their eleven-month-old baby.

The attack occurred in August of 2024 at the victim's home in Highlands Ranch. According to testimony, the victim confronted Golgoon about household chores. He pursued her into the locked bathroom, where he grabbed her by the throat with both hands and squeezed. The victim experienced blurred vision and dizziness as Golgoon threw her into the sink, and then against the bathroom door.

Golgoon was convicted of second-degree assault, third-degree assault, and child abuse. The jury also determined the crimes constituted acts of domestic violence.

Deputy District Attorney David Bosner, who prosecuted the case, said the verdict reflects the strength of the victim's courage and the commitment of the DA's Office. "These are tough cases and deal with extremely sensitive subject matters. Our office will always take the difficult cases to make our community a safer place. We are grateful the victim had her day in court. Although nothing can undo her suffering, our hope is this verdict brings her a measure of justice and peace."

Douglas County Sheriff Darren Weekly praised the collaborative work of law enforcement and prosecutors that led to the conviction. "Domestic violence has no place in Douglas County, and our office will always pursue these cases to the fullest extent of the law. Our

Deputies and Domestic Violence Detectives did a phenomenal job gathering evidence and working closely with the District Attorney's Office to ensure this violent offender was removed from the community and the victim and family were protected. Seeing justice served and safety restored is why we do what we do."

District Attorney George Brauchler said the case highlights his office's dedication to protecting victims of domestic violence. "What kind of man assaults the mother of his child...while she holds their infant daughter? There is little hope of changing someone whose thinking is this angry and self-involved. The only answer that will protect our community and send an unmistakable message about how we view domestic violence here: prison. He will have plenty of opportunities to try out his abusive moves on his cell mate."

Golgoon will be sentenced January 29, 2026. He faces up to six years in prison.
