Castle Rock Man Cuts off Ankle Monitor and Flees Before Being Found Guilty of Sexual Assault on a Child. DA's Office Asking for Help in Finding Him

Douglas County, CO –Today a jury found a 42-year-old Castle Rock man guilty of five counts of sexual assault on a child as part of a pattern of abuse. Now that man is on the run.

Jorge Alberto Campos was not in court to hear the verdict in the four-day trial. After failing to show up in court, authorities found his ankle monitor discarded in a dumpster near his home. He remains at large. The DA's office and Castle Rock Police are asking for help in finding him.

Campos was convicted of repeatedly assaulting his current girlfriend's daughter from 2021-2023, at the family home beginning when she was 11 years old.

Castle Rock Police arrested Campos in May of 2024 after a nurse at Castle Rock hospital alerted them to a sexual assault victim receiving treatment. The child had been taken to the hospital by her mother, who thought her daughter had made up the story of being sexually assaulted. The examination found evidence consistent with her claims.

During the investigation, the victim told police the assaults began while she was in middle school. She stated Campos warned her not to tell her mother, and he used an app to control her phone as a form of punishment.

Deputy District Attorney Brynn Chase, who prosecuted the case, praised the victim's strength in coming forward and testifying.

"The courage this young woman showed in reporting the abuse and testifying in court cannot be overstated," said Chase. "She was violated, villainized, and voiceless and faced unimaginable trauma with remarkable strength. But she found her voice and brought it with her to the witness stand. We hope this verdict brings her a sense of justice and vindication." Senior Deputy DA Abby Hegarty emphasized the significance of the outcome. "This individual exploited a vulnerable child and has now been held fully accountable," said Hegarty. Because of the victim's extraordinary courage, a dangerous predator will be removed from the community-hopefully for many years to come."

But first, Campos has to be found.

District Attorney George Brauchler condemned Campos' actions and flight from justice. "There is a child rapist on the loose in our community. This gutless predator not only preyed upon a child-a courageous child-but then fled from accountability," said Brauchler. "We want him back so he can serve out the lengthy prison sentence he has earned. Campos is a coward. Please help us get him back where he belongs."

Campos faces mandatory prison, up to a life sentence, when he is found. A sentencing date will be set when/if he is returned to custody.
