Douglas County Serial Rapist will spend 20 Years to Life in Prison.

Castle Rock CO –A 25-year-old Parker man who sexually assaulted three young women in 2025, will spend twenty years to life in the Colorado Department of Corrections.

Javier Rodriguez-Andrade pleaded guilty to charges stemming from three sexual assaults involving victims between the ages of 19 and 24. The assaults occurred at his apartment and at an apartment belonging to friends. Two of the assaults occurred while he was out on bond for an earlier sexual assault.

According to investigators, all three victims were highly intoxicated at the time of the assaults and were not romantically involved with Rodriguez-Andrade. Detectives believe there may be additional victims and are asking anyone with information to come forward.

The victims' willingness to come forward, combined with an extensive investigation by the Parker Police Department and the Douglas County Sheriff's Office, ultimately led to the defendant admitting to the crimes.

Rodriguez-Andrade pleaded guilty to felony sexual assault, attempted sexual assault, burglary with intent to commit sexual assault, and a crime of violence causing serious bodily injury.

“Sexual assault is a deeply devastating crime, and the Parker Police Department remains committed to conducting thorough investigations and seeking justice for victims,” said Parker Police Chief Jim Tsurapas. “I commend the victims for their courage in coming forward and recognize our detectives and law enforcement partners for their dedication to holding this defendant accountable.”

“Mr. Rodriguez-Andrade engaged in a disturbing pattern of dominating women by exploiting them when they were helpless to escape,” said Deputy District Attorney Brynn Chase. “While he felt entitled to these girls’ bodies, the only thing he is entitled to is an extended stay in the Department of Corrections.”

Douglas County Sheriff Darren Weekly praised investigators and the victims for their role in bringing Rodriguez-Andrade to justice. “This conviction removes a dangerous predator from our streets and holds him accountable,” said Weekly. “I deeply commend the courage of the victims for coming forward. Their bravery, paired with the relentless work of our Special Victims Unit detective, and the District Attorney’s Office, made this guilty plea possible. We remain fully committed to fighting for victims and protecting our community.”

District Attorney George Brauchler said the sentence demonstrates the seriousness with which his office treats sexual violence. “This outcome is due to the courage of the victims here,” said Brauchler. “We need so much more of this and should acknowledge it when it happens. Those who have selfishly and inhumanely concluded that a person’s intoxication is an invitation to sexually assault them- like this predator did-are at odds with the law. And decency. And our continued approach will be to hold them accountable by removing them from society, at least until our legislature further weakens our laws.”

Rodriguez-Andrade will be sentenced October 30th.
